Democrats: Mean & Evil – The Democrats are Anti-Israel

(Chapter 10 from Mean, Evil & Violent, a new e-book by FedUp PAC, 2020)

Can this be the Democrat Party of Harry Truman, who made the United States the first country to recognize Israel in 1948, providing crucial support for the Jewish state at its birth?

How far the Democrats have fallen from John F. Kennedy, who told the Zionists of America Convention in 1960: "Israel will endure and flourish. It is the child of hope."

The Democrat Party of the 21st century has betrayed that legacy. Today, it's the home of Jew-hatred and efforts to undercut Israel's security. The most prominent anti-Semites in America are connected to what bills itself as the party of inclusiveness and tolerance.

The Democrat Party—Anti-Semitism's Home Address:

In May, New York's Democratic Mayor Bill De Blasio attacked the entire Jewish population of the New York area, due to perceived breaches of social distancing guidelines at the funeral of an Hasidic rabbi. De Blasio tweeted: "My message to the Jewish community, and all communities, is simple: the time for warnings has passed." But only the Jewish community was singled out for censure.

New York's police commissioner disclosed that his department had coordinated the funeral. The day of the funeral, thousands of New Yorkers turned out for a demonstration by the Flying Angels over the skies of Manhattan, which drew no rebuke from the mayor.

In response to De Blasio's attack, over 100 Jewish leaders signed a letter to the mayor stating, "In the midst of an historic wave of anti-Semitic violence in New

York City, our community has been feeling the pain of being singled out and blamed for the spread of this disease.”

Unfair though it may have been, De Blasio’s condemnation was mild compared to the outright anti-Semitism of two freshmen House Democrats.

Rep. Ilhan Omar (D-Minn.) has charged Israel’s supporters with pushing “allegiance to a foreign country.” Rep. Rashida Talib (D-MI) said Congressmen who refused to support the pro-terrorism Boycott, Sanctions and Divestment Movement “forgot what country they represent.” This is ironic coming from women who invariably support international Islam over the United States.

In 2019, six weeks before the AIPAC (American Israel Public Affairs Committee) Convention, Omar explained that Congressional support for Israel was “all about the Benjamins”—in other words, support for Israel is bought and paid for with what anti-Semites call “Jewish money.”

Both legislators tried to go to Israel under the sponsorship of a Palestinian group called Miftah, which promotes the blood libel—the lie that Jews kill Christian children to use their blood for Passover.

When some members of the House of Representatives wanted a resolution condemning Omar’s anti-Semitism, Speaker Nancy Pelosi had it watered down to include diverse forms of bigotry.

Omar’s name was never even mentioned. Pelosi said of the Minnesota rep., “I feel confident that her words were not based on any anti-Semitic attitude.” Only someone with ideological blinders on could believe something which clearly contradicts reality.

For decades now, Democrat candidates have made a pilgrimage to Harlem, to be anointed by the Reverend Al Sharpton. Hillary Clinton did when she first ran for the U.S. Senate in the year 2000. At the start of the current campaign, Biden called Sharpton a “champion in the fight for civil rights” and Elizabeth Warren hailed him as a man who “has dedicated his life to the fight for justice for all.” Sen. Kamala Harris concurred.

In so doing, these Democrat leaders heaped praise on a vile anti-Semite with blood on his hands.

In 1991, Sharpton rushed to the defense of New York City College Professor Leonard Jeffries, who claimed, “Jews financed the slave trade,” and Hollywood Jews “put together a system of destruction of black people.”

In the same year (Sharpton was a busy little storm trooper), a Jewish driver accidentally killed a black child in the Crown Heights neighborhood of Brooklyn. Sharpton demagogued at the child’s funeral and led demonstrations that essentially blamed the Jewish community of Crown Heights for the tragedy. This was followed by several days of rioting and the stabbing death of a rabbinical student to shouts of “Kill the Jews.”

On the heels of Crown Heights came Freddy’s Fashion Mart, four years later, involving a dispute between a Jewish tenant and a black sub-tenant, with the typical allegations of the Jew trying to force out the black man.

After several weeks of picketing by Sharpton’s National Action Network, one of the demonstrators stormed Freddy’s, shot and killed several employees and set the place on fire. The oft rehabilitated Sharpton has never apologized for any of this, any more than he’s apologized for the Tawana Brawley hoax about white men (including a county prosecutor) abducting and raping a black teen.

That Sharpton is an icon of the Democrat Party—praised by at least three candidates for the party’s 2020 presidential nomination—speaks volumes about the evil eating away at the soul of a once great institution.

But Sharpton is strictly bush league next to Louis Farrakhan. The Nation of Islam leader is the most prominent and outspoken anti-Semite in America today.

Here’s a sampling of “Minister” Farrakhan’s poisonous rhetoric:

“Jews were responsible for all of the filth and degenerate behavior that Hollywood is putting out, turning men into women and women into men.”

“Did you know pedophilia, homosexuality, sex trafficking is the work of Talmudists (Farrakhan’s code word for Jews)?”

“When you want something in this world, the Jew holds the door.”

“It is now becoming apparent that there were many Israelis and Zionist Jews in key roles in the 9/11 attacks.”

“German Jews financed Hitler right here in America...International bankers financed Hitler and poor Jews died while big Jews were at the root of what you call the Holocaust.”

There are multiple ties between Farrakhan and the National Democratic Party. The Congressional Black Caucus has met with him. Barack Obama was involved in his 2005 Million Man March. California Democrats Maxine Waters and Barbara Lee have attended Nation of Islam events. At the 2018 funeral of jazz legend Aretha Franklin, ex-President Bill Clinton felt comfortable sharing the stage with him.

The Minister of Chicago’s United Church of Christ before he retired, the Rev. Jeremiah Wright is a Farrakhan clone. To wit:” Israel is an apartheid state,” “Jesus was a Palestinian,” and “Ethnic cleansing is going on in Gaza.”

He was also one of the formative influences in the life of Barack Obama. The future president attended Wright’s church for 16 years. He and Michelle were married there. He praised him and took the title of his book, “The Audacity of Hope,” from one of Wright’s sermons.

He didn’t dissociate himself from the man he called his spiritual mentor until things got too hot in his first presidential campaign. Even then, he would only condemn his words, not Wright himself.

The man who hopes to be the next sitting president, Vice President Joe Biden, isn’t openly anti-Semitic or anti-Israel. He just wants to undercut Israel’s security on multiple fronts.

Biden says that if elected, he will reopen the PLO diplomatic Mission in Washington. D.C., as well as the U.S. consulate in East Jerusalem, not that it’s needed with the U.S. embassy now located there. It’s just another obeisance to the terrorists who call themselves the Palestinian Authority.

Under Biden, the U.S will resume aid to the PA in Ramallah, even though part of our funding was used to pay the families of terrorists who died in action (the so-called pay to slay program).

Since almost half the world’s Jews (46%) live in Israel, it may reasonably be argued that whatever imperils Israel is ipso facto anti-Semitic.

The Democrat Party’s drift (some would say headlong rush) into anti-Semitism parallels the growing influence within the party of the radical left, which began with George McGovern in 1972.

The left's agenda of the 1960s has become the Democrats' platform of the 21st century: anti-Americanism, socialism, anti-colonialism and white guilt. Their allies include the most militant elements in the black community and others with a deep loathing for both Israel and the Jewish people. This would include the "Black Hebrew Israelites" who killed three in an attack on a kosher market in Jersey City last December.

Israel is seen as a colonial power, usurping and exploiting an indigenous people. In reality, Jews were the original indigenous people and brought prosperity to a wasteland when they began returning in substantial numbers in the late 19th century.

In America, Jews are perhaps the most successful minority. This incites both envy and conspiracy theories.

For Democrats, wealth is a zero-sum game. At least subconsciously, many believe that Jewish success must come at someone else's expense. This gives credence to anti-Semitic canards and conspiracy theories about Jewish cupidity, feelings of superiority and a drive to dominate and exploit the rest of humanity.

The 19th century German Social Democratic leader August Babel declared, "Anti-Semitism is the socialism of fools." With Sanders, Warren, AOC and the Squad in the ascendancy, Democrats now have both socialism and the socialism of fools.
